

Title I School-Level Parent and Family Engagement Policy West Fresno Middle School

 - If requested by parents, the school Principal or designee will place the request as an item on the agenda at the next regularly scheduled meeting
- e) If the schoolwide program is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, submit any parent comments on the plan when the school makes the plan available to the local educational agency. (20 USC 6318 (c)(6))
 - If parent(s) indicate that schoolwide program is not satisfactory, School Principal or designee shall submit parent(s) comments along with program evaluation and/or the SPSA to the District and Board.

Building Capacity for Involvement

To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, each school and district assisted with Title I, Part A funds, the school has established the following practices:
